

AIHEC Research Survey on the Impact of COVID-19 on TCU Student Experiences February 2021

In fall 2020, nearly 500 Tribal College and University (TCU) students participated in a study on the impact of the COVID-19 on their coursework and their daily lives. The survey results, published here for the first time, provide a valuable needs assessment tool and data to assist the TCUs and AIHEC in better meeting the needs of their students. The first study of its kind, the survey posed an array of questions focusing on persistence, online learning, and physical and mental well-being. The results underscore the far-reaching effects of the pandemic on TCUs, Native students, and their communities.

The AIHEC survey is based on a survey published in June 2020, by Arizona State University (ASU): "The Impact of COVID-19 on Student Experiences and Expectations: Evidence from a Survey," conducted in spring 2020. Like the ASU survey results, AIHEC's findings give a clear picture of what students are experiencing in these pandemic times. AIHEC requested permission from ASU's team of researchers to adapt their questionnaire for its own use, to make the questions relevant to TCU students and the tribal communities TCUs serve. The ASU research team graciously granted permission. AIHEC wishes to acknowledge and thank Esteban M. Aucejo, Jacob F, French, Maria Paola Ugalde Araya, and Basit Zafar of Arizona State University.

During the fall 2020 term, the TCUs recruited returning students to participate in the survey; 486 students provided valid responses.


Respondent Demographics (N=486)

- Overall TCU population: 87% Al/AN; 13% non-Native


Gender

- Overall TCU population: 69% female; 31% male; 0.05% other/prefer not to say




Marital Status and Dependents





Before the COVID-19 pandemic, did you have any experience with online classes? (N=482)


Experience with Online/Distance Learning

- No, had not taken online or hybrid classes


Has the COVID-19 pandemic affected your graduation plan? (N=482)






How likely is it that you will graduate with your intended credential/degree from this institution? (N=482)

How likely is it that you will take a break from college in the next term starting in winter/spring 2021? (N=481)




Do you know anyone who has contracted COVID-19? (N=438)


91% responded that they knew someone who had contracted the virus.

Taking into account all sources of income, how likely are you to be able to cover the cost of attending this institution if you enroll in the next term (winter/spring)? (N=484)




Which of the following applied to you during summer 2020? (N=485)






Have you lost a job or had a reduction in hours/pay since March 2020? (N=486)




Which of the following applies to you? (N=483)


What do you plan to do after your finish your studies at this institution? (N=486)




How far are you willing to commute or move away from your home community/reservation for employment? (N=474)






Below are some reasons that may be important when choosing a career. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, has the importance of these factors to you changed? (N=474)

As a result of the pandemic, has the importance of these factors in choosing a career changed?




What is your major? Please choose the one that fits most closely. (N=475) Respondent Majors




Has your choice of major been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic? (N=474)

Choice of Major was Affected by Pandemic




Please compare your online learning experiences with in-person classes. (N=460)

Online Learning Experiences Compared With In-Person Classes.




If you were given the choice, would you rather take a course online/remote or in-person? (N=461)

Given the choice, students would rather attend class ...




Did you withdraw from any classes because of the COVID-19 pandemic? (N=461)


Withdrew from Any Classes Due to Pandemic


